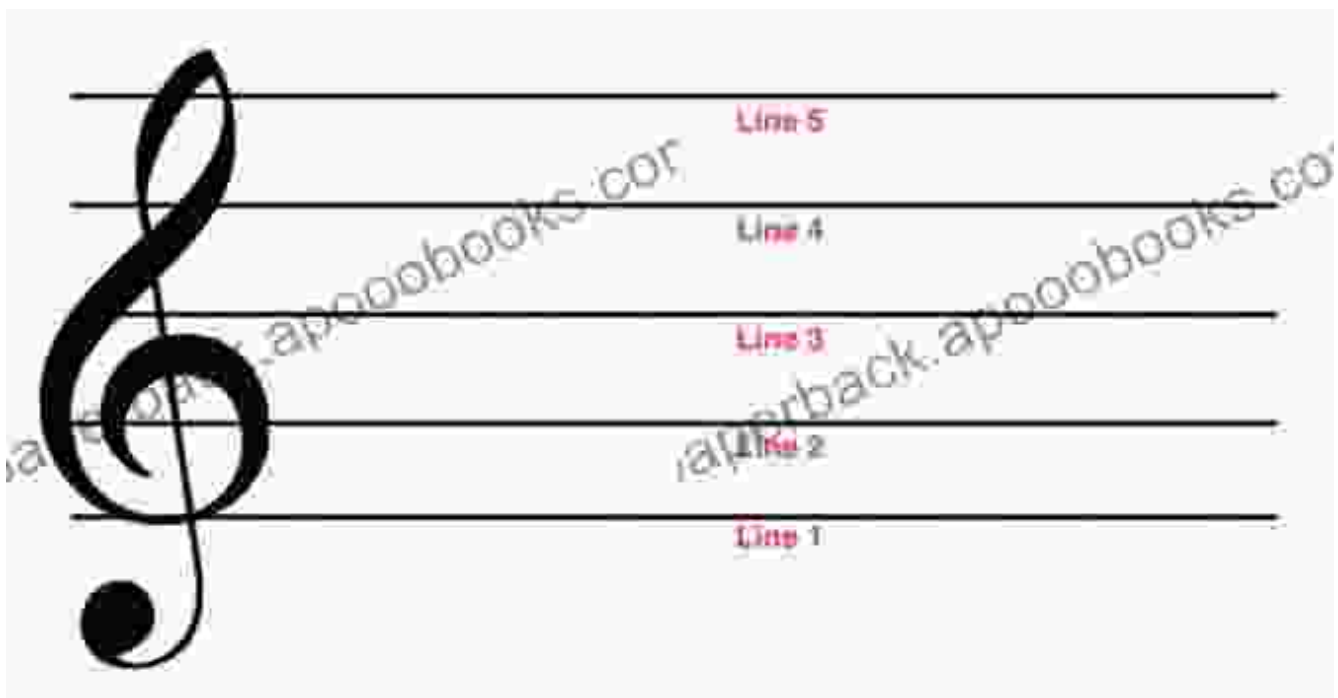

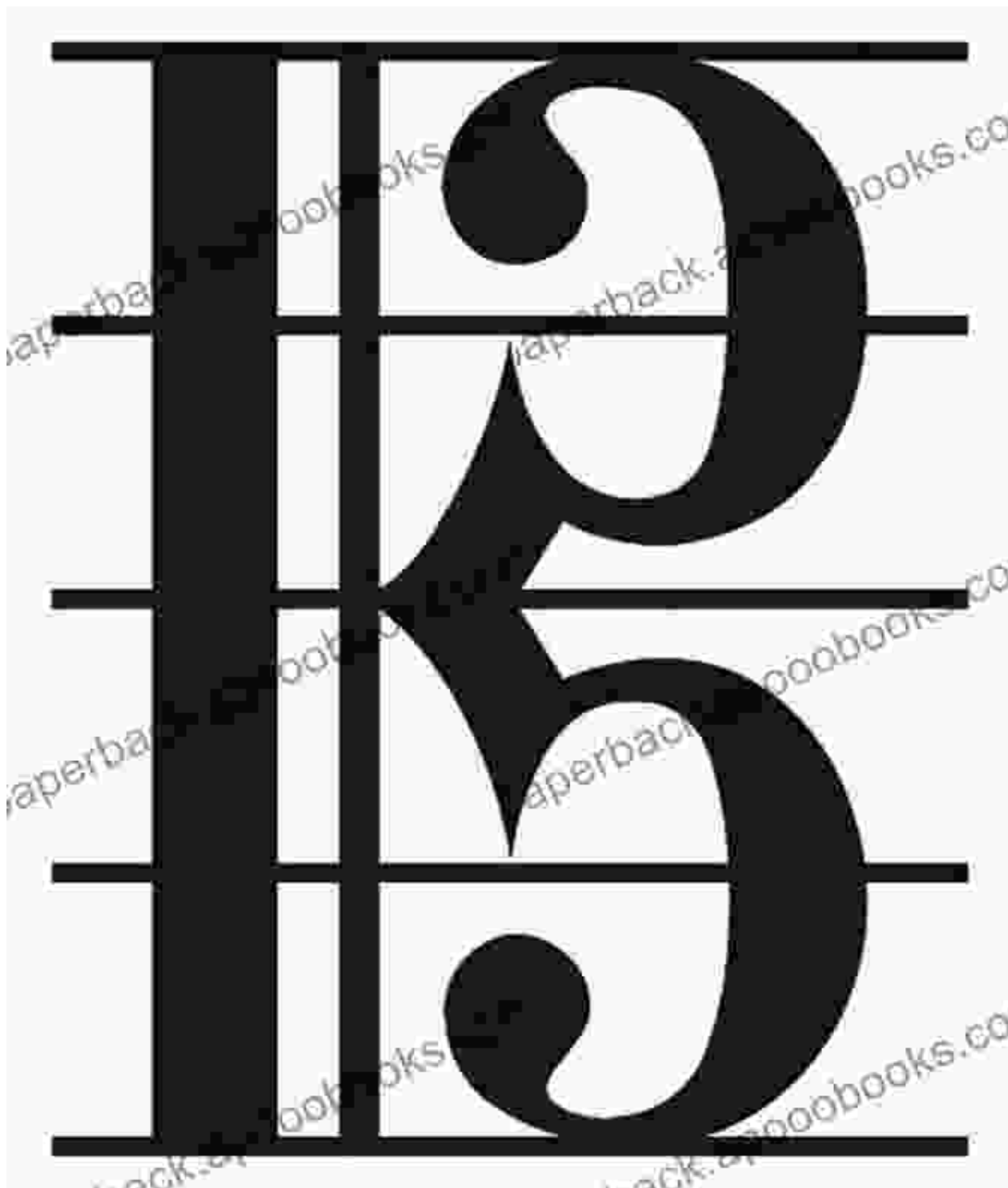

A 4 on the bottom means a quarter note will equal 1 beat.
As a beginner, this is what will be the case for the majority of your music.

An 8 on the bottom means an eighth note will equal 1 beat.
These types of time signatures are very common, but as a beginner, you don't need to work with them until later in your learning.

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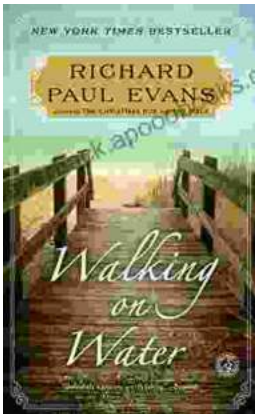
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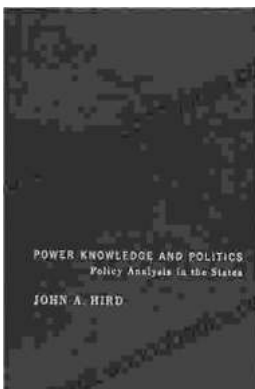
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
