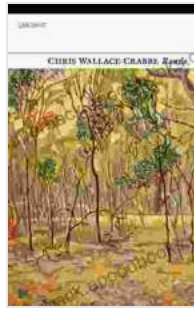

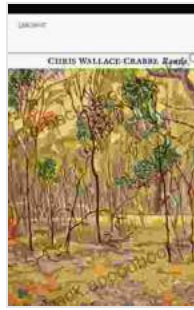


Rondo Jim Wagner in later years

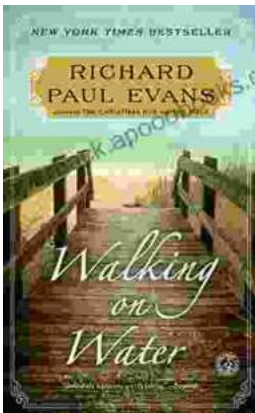

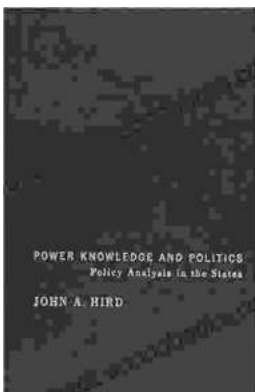
