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## Materials

To do this, place two star blocks right sides together and sew them together along one side. Then, sew the other two sides of the star blocks together. Continue sewing star blocks together until you have a quilt top.
6. **Quilt the quilt.** Once you have a quilt top, you need to quilt it. Quilting is the process of sewing the quilt top, batting, and backing fabric together. There are many different ways to quilt a quilt, but we recommend using a simple straight-line stitch for beginners.

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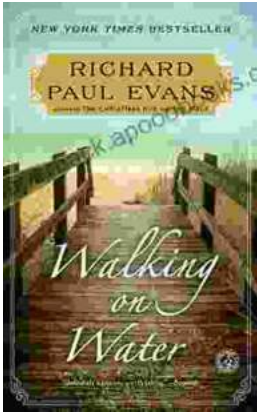
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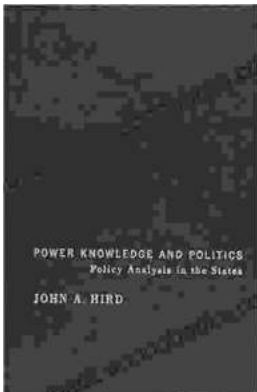
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
